Supporting research dissemination through peer reviewed publication

VIU is committed to sharing the knowledge that emerges from faculty and student research. The Publish Grants are part of a new suite of programs to support the realization of the Scholarship, Research and Creative Activity Plan (2017-22).

The **Publication Grants** support the **Communicate** objective of this plan by supporting faculty to publish their findings in peer reviewed open access journals and books published by high quality publishers. The grants are available on a first-come-first serve basis to corresponding authors as a one-time contribution to publication costs. Grants may be awarded in arrears, up to 6 months following publication. No funds will be released until the applicant provides an invoice from the publisher. All funds must be used within 1 year of approval and a copy of the publication is required for reporting purposes. The funding for this program comes from the Chestnut Fund established by Chuck Chestnut, a former VIU Professor.

Application Process:

Submit a 1-2 page proposal and supporting materials to srca@viu.ca including:

1. Your name, department and email
2. Title and an abstract of the article or summary of the book/chapter (300 words max)
3. Name of intended publisher and journal (if applicable)
4. Status of publication; if not submitted give anticipated date of submission
5. Justification of publisher: enhancement of career, impact factor, dissemination impact, reputation etc.
6. Budget- breakdown of amount requested
